Open Invitation — Plan Now!

Hi Guys,

As you may know I am the CD of the Rocky Mountain FF Champs. I converted this meet and the MMM club to FAC rules around 2000. The MMM is fully committed to the success and popularity of FAC, and wants to see as many scale flyers on our field as possible. Unfortunately we've never seen more than about 4-5 contestants in scale, but we've never promoted the scale events much. We will have 4 FAC events on the schedule for 2007: Scale, Peanut, Power, and Golden Age. These four will have awards and will be eligible for the RMC grand champion perpetual trophy. Judging is on the field, just bring the model at noon any of the days.

This is the first year we are holding Golden Age, at the request of Herb Kothe who enjoys flying it. It will be per the FAC rules: 3 flight total with 45 point minimum. All of the FAC events may be flown any day (Sept 1,2, or 3) but all flying must be completed on the same day started.

For 2007 we can add as many unofficial FAC events as you guys want. Basically anything that'll draw three or more flyers so we can award Kanonen. I was thinking WWII Mass Launch at a minimum, and how about Greve/Thompson combo ML? Any thing else you guys would like to fly...Dime scale perhaps? Jimmie Allen? Speak up. I don't want to hold an event unless 3 or more guys speak up and say they'll definitely fly it. Based on this year's support of unofficial events, next year we'll have awards for anything with more than 3 flyers.

Nitty gritty: The MMM field is huge (5x7 miles...no that is *not* a misprint) and the weather in early Sept is definitely the best of the whole year. Winds are usually 5-10 or less, AM lows in the lower 50s to highs in the upper 70s. RMFFC is an AMA sanctioned event so entrants must be members. That is not negotiable—our field lease states it. You can arrive

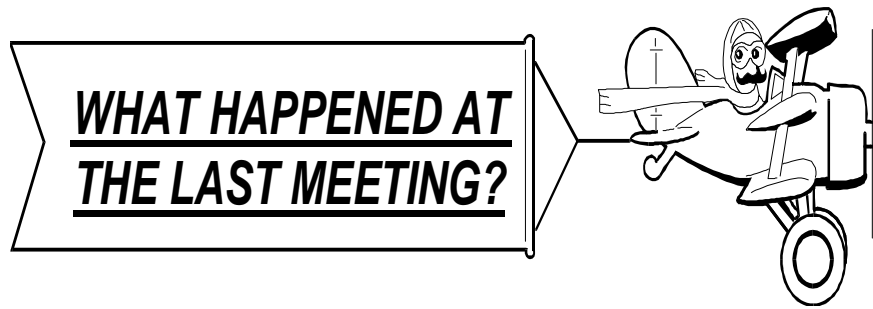

The previous meeting minutes were approved as published.

It was done up in silkspan and trimmed in his red-white and blue motif. Les DeWitt brought a 1938 Zaic "Chatelain" Wakefield model done up in thin mylar and different bright colors. The model framework was 20 yrs. old and recently recovered. Jim O'Reilly displayed 2 Best-By-Test Stratometers. One was new and the other older model was a back up ship that saved the day when the rubber motor broke in his primary model at a recent contest. Bill Schmidt had a recently completed 1947 Bellanca Crusair 26" rubber scale model of his own design, the latest in his line of classic American light planes. He also had a 1/2A nostalgia 1956 Jay's Bird, with a Wen-Mac .049 done up in red and white poly-span..

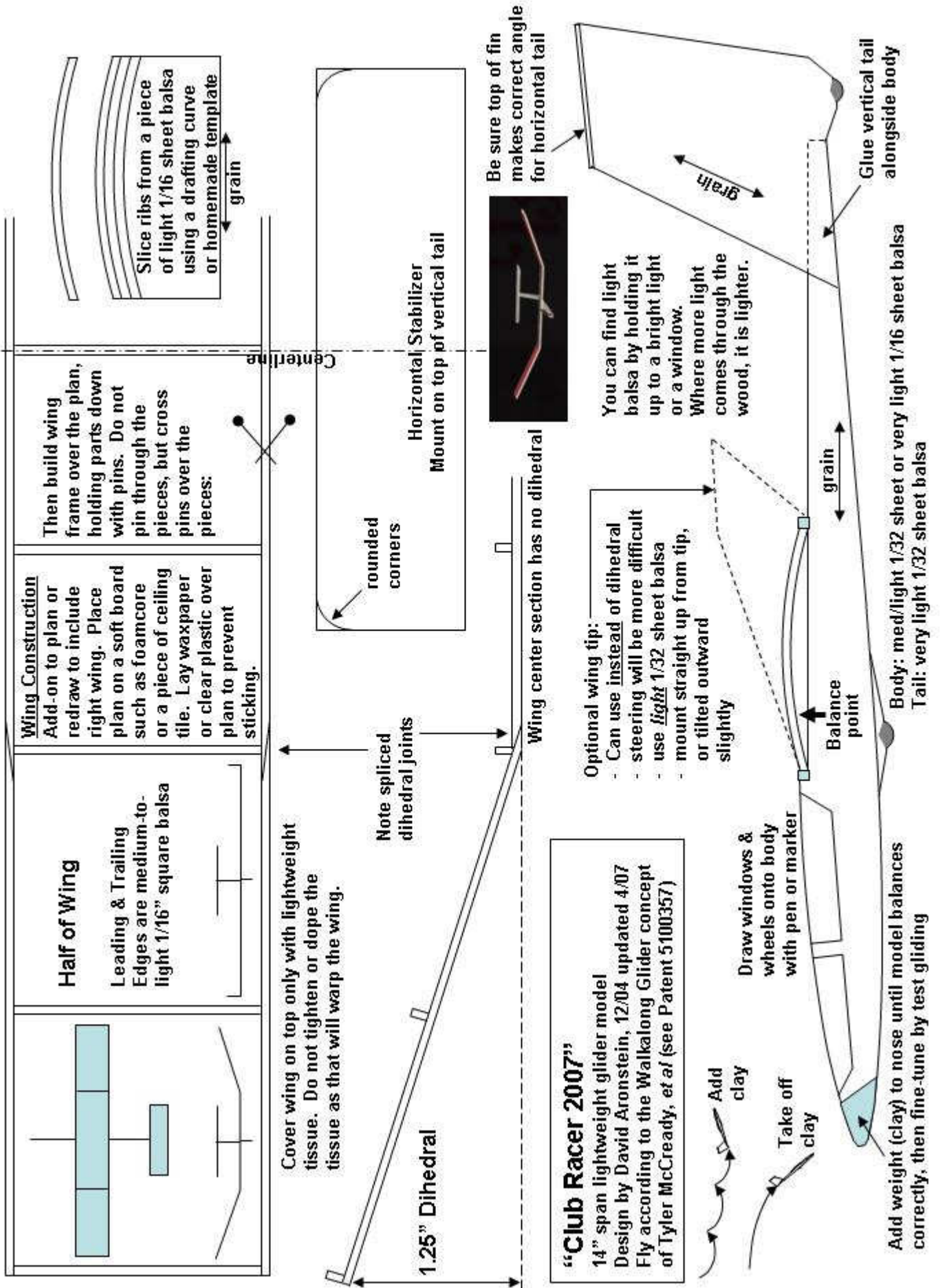

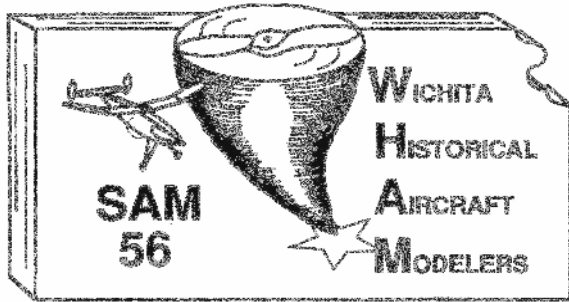

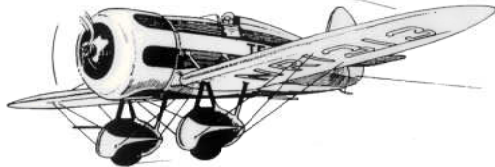
