MMAC Indoor News Report by Gordon Dona

The indoor flying this season has been a little low key but not without some bright spots. The Bloomington Armory gym has been available each monthly meeting evening and has provided a great venue for test flying. There has been an event scheduled for each month, but actual competition (friendly or otherwise) had been a little sparse. The best showings were the first month featuring the Watkins Feather Plane event and later with the Phantom Flash. 3 or 4 planes showed up each time including a particularly enthusiastically flown Feather Plane that Dennis Sussman's granddaughter Callie trimmed out with great success. Another pleasant surprise was Bill Roos sporting a NEW phantom flash. There has been less response in the other months with less interest shown for No-Cal and Butterfly. The Butterfly evening was probably more the result of Dennis Sussman departing in search of his final thermal that afternoon, so most of us were feeling a little too somber to fly. We have had some additional noteworthy highpoints. The top winners in Science Olympiad for both middle school and high school practiced at our sessions and consulted with MMAC members, proving the value of mentorship, expertise, preparation and practice. Congratulations to the winners! Other bright spots on the test flying scene included several nice looking scale models flown by Greg Thomas and John Fogg, and a whole quiver of new gliders that Steve Oakins brought out in March.

With an eye toward next year, if anyone has a suggestion for an event or events that would draw more participation, please bring up your idea at the meeting. Our "real" indoor competition season begins and ends with the annual contest in April. There's still time to build and repair and even test fly a little. Hope to see you there.

Science Olympiad Report By Jim Ladwig

MMAC members once again were in charge of the aviation events of the Minnesota Science Olympiad competition held on two weekends in

early March at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul.

In B Division (Middle School) Balloon Launch Glider the best time was achieved by Hannah Nesser of Capitol Hill school. Her score was 63.4, based on flights of 24.7, 26.6 and 36.8 seconds. Second place in BLG went to Delano, with a score of 60.7, based on flights of 27.3, 28.0 and 32.7 seconds. Third place in BLG went to Northfield, with a score of 44.5, based on flights of 22.9, 13.6 and 21.6 seconds.

In C Division (High School) Wright Stuff the best time was achieved by Dan Dorsch of Eastview High School in Apple Valley. His score was 145.4, based on flights of 145.4 and 130.3 seconds. Second place in WS went to Minnetonka, with a score of 142.6, based on flights of 130.2 and 142.6 seconds. Third place in WS went to Orono, with a score of 135.7, based on flights of 135.7 and 134.7 seconds.

None of the six were on the winning teams going to the National Event. Those schools are Kenwood Trail JHS in the B Division and Mounds View HS in the C Division. -jiml

April 19, 2008 Memorial Indoor Contest By Dave Edmonson

Twelve MMAC members and 4 Science Olympiad students arrived to enter a total of 41 events. Die-hards Gordon Dona and Dave Edmonson each entered 7 events to give the gymnasium a work out. Jim Jorgensen entered 4 events, and did a fine job of flying with an Easy B flight of 5:44. After a little bit of arm twisting, Dale Mendenhall went to the car to bring in his Super Bulldog which has come in first for the past 3 years, and flying with the same piece of magic rubber again.

HLG/CLG has been diminishing in entries over the past few years, but Steve Oakins promises to come out next year and WOOP us! Steve is preparing to move into a new house shortly, and was tied up in packing...

It was good to see Ray Neaman and friends come to watch, and we had a few other visitors including Craig Lamatsch who took some pictures that would be good to publish.

After the HLG/CLG events, the floor was turned over to the light weight models. The first hour went well, but during the last ½ hour the heating system came on and blew everything out of the air, and some to pieces including Gordon’s nice record setting Easy B. Gordon flew PennyPlane first, and I flew Easy B first, and so when we switched events, the fans came on, and it was impossible to get over 3 minutes. Earlier, my Mini-stick went to the ceiling in 40 seconds and stuck to the ceiling truss, and upon release took 5 ½ minutes to come down. On my last flight, it went up to the ceiling again and lodged right in the middle of some netting. The wing was broken off trying to get it down, and I figured a lot more damage to the fuselage and prop, but after I got home, it went back together quickly, so it is ready for next year!

It was surprising that none of the Science Olympiad students entered the Junior event, because there were no entries, and they could have flown another event!

Gordon went after the No-Cal scale event with a vengeance after being tromped by Jim Ladwig last year. Gordon doubled Jim’s time in that event to redeem himself. Now Gordon has to make a comeback in Easy-B after coming in 3rd.

We did not have any problem with the heating system last year, so it kind of took us by surprise when they came on. The reason being that it was quite cool outside this year vs last year when it was very sunny and warm. Perhaps we need to fly the light stuff earlier next year if the weather is cool outside again?

Another comment about our indoor season is that we scheduled all of our flying sessions, with the exception of this contest, to coincide with the meeting night. As a result, loading up all of the gear to fly for an hour is much work for little flying time, or else, as some did, they just skipped the meeting. Possibly fewer flying sessions next year on non-meeting dates would be better?

Aaron Petersen did a nice job with 3 first places, Bostonian, Phantom Flash, and Peanut Scale.

Dennis was always a hard worker for the club taking over the treasury duties, and nearly all of the prize committee tasks for many years.

Dennis wanted to go to the 2008 NATS, but said that if we did not team up for the trip, he would not attend. I guess that is resolved now..darn!

In the past few years Dennis has experienced a lot of joy in working with his granddaughter Calli to teach her how to build and fly models. Dennis only flew power models through his contest career, and everyone can attest to his determination to make his FireBirds fly. Actually his reputation as a FireBird flyer was of national renown during the 2005 NATS.

More recently Dennis has been constructing a TD 020 Hustler model, and the last time that I was over in his disgustingly immaculate workshop, it was ready for covering. Dennis had this workshop that was brightly lit, everything organized and in its place.

Recently Calli and Dennis were working on a PeeWee 30 Sniffer, and Gary Oakins is helping her finish it up. Dennis had the patience to work with Calli for months getting a little rubber model completed.

Dennis, you will be missed on the flying field for a long time!
