## HAFFA – July Meeting 7/19/2011 by Dana Field

Meeting was called to order at 7:07

### Old Business

- 1) Mike Basta read the minutes of the May & June meetings. The minutes were approved as presented.
- 2) Previous balance was \$731.89. There was a \$40.00 fee paid for the AMA contest sanction and insurance certificate for the City of Marion leaving a balance of \$691.89.
- 3) Brochures – various options for printing were discussed. It was decided to print 100 at UPS (around \$70+ dollars) to get us going, and Dana Field to try ink jet printing more at a lower cost. The June meeting notice was posted at Hobby Haven (no response), and we would like to get future notices, along with club brochures, posted there.
- 4) Shirts and hats – Based on last months discussion, Mike Basta is going to have an order form for the newsletter next month. Jeff Renz is to send out a questionnaire to generate interest.

### New Business

- 1) Jeff Renz wants a HAFFA sign on a pole, like car dealerships do, at the Marion contest. Jeff to find out cost for producing.
- 2) Airshow – cancelled the last year or so, is on for August this year.
- 3) School clubs, contests, etc, decided to table until start of new school year the end of August or Sept.

I'm experimenting with a new rubber system for A-6. I'm on the right track but this needs much more refinement. We can't get in to Beatrice until October. They still haven't replaced the lights yet. I spoke with Annette today in the City Offices. I did book October 22nd and 23rd for the Fall contest.

### Jeff Renz

I have not been able to build much or fly much this summer. However, we had two club meetings in June and July at a school within the confines a large school yard field and flew gliders in the heat. It was a lot of fun. One night we had 8 people show up with 6 or 7 flying catapult and HLG. The next time we had 5 and it was cracking the 100 degree mark. We still flew anyway and it did cool off.

Also our members have been working with youth at Ozanam home every other week with the HAFFA club. We usually have at least 3 club members show up to help the kids build models. Usually just 3 students. I have used this as a great chance to learn to trim airplanes because those "charlie brown" airplanes need a lot of help and adjustments some times. Most of the time it takes 3 meetings to complete the tissue covered stick models. We build an outdoor version and an indoor version. We try to let the kids build as much of it as they can ....which is hard to let them go at it because the outcome is pretty rough with a lot of broken sticks. Anyway the models generally do fly which is quite exiting because most of those kids have never seen a model really fly.

## Annual Indoor Championship Event: 2011-2012

The club has selected **A-6** for the annual HAFFA Indoor Championship Contest event. The scoring method will be the same as last year. There will be just one flight, a mass launch. The contest is held once every month at **Ozaman** beginning with the October monthly flying session. The seasons ends with the April 7th Indoor Contest at **Osawatomie**.

Points will be given as follows: One point for entering and one point for each person you beat. High total of monthly points determines the champion. Should there be ties, remember, one point for each person you beat. If you tie, you have not beaten the person you tie. For example, five people enter a mass launch. The first plane lands: one point. The second plane lands: two points. The third & fourth planes land at the same time: each gets three points. The fifth & last plane lands: five points.

NOTE: Steering is not allowed for the this event.

### **Indoor Free Flight -FREE FLIGHT INDOOR RUBBER**

**26. A-6. For event (222 )**

**26.1. General.** Except for the specific rules which apply directly to A-6, the rules for Free Flight Indoor Rubber, Hand Launched Stick model shall apply.

**26.2.** The model shall be rubber powered and covered with paper.

**26.3.** The total maximum projected wing area shall be 30 square inches. There is no restriction on the stabilizer area.

**26.4.** All wing, stabilizer and rudder wood including wing posts shall be 1/16" square wood minimum, except ribs shall be 1/32" X 1/16" minimum. Posts may be rounded in the area of the mounting tubes.

**26.5.** The motor stick shall be from solid wood of 6" maximum length measured from the front thrust bearing face to the front of the rear hook.

**26.6.** The propeller shall be 6" maximum diameter with flat blades from balsa no thinner than 1/32".

**26.7.** The minimum weight of the model shall be 1.2 grams without rubber motor.

**26.8.** No special materials such as boron, carbon fiber or foam are to be used.
