

The 40th U.S. FF Championships were held October 9-11, 2010 with 59 flyers, great competition and perfect flying weather for the Category II Events. We had flyers participate from California, Arizona, New Mexico, Nevada and Canada in this year's Championship. Standard events included AMA, Classic, Nostalgia and Old Timer. The Special events were Gollywock Mass Launch, Twin Pusher, Dawn Mulvihill, Night Gas, High Time and both Rubber and Power ROW events.

Don Bartick was the first one to try the ROW and got off on the first try.



The most popular Standard event of the weekend was 1/2 A Nostalgia with 13 competitors. Bob Sundberg paced the field for the win scoring 900 seconds. C Nostalgia was the second most popular Standard event with 9 competitors and Don Kaiser walked away as the winner with 720 seconds. Jeff Ellington won the High Time Award with 1805 seconds. A total of 46 events were contested over the 3 day weekend which kept everyone busy. We saw a lot of beautiful airplanes, several great times posted, and unfortunately a few spectacular crashes. It made for an interesting contest.

Surprise! Surprise! Surprise! Old Timer Events were the most popular at U.S. FF Champs with 24 flyers. This caught me by surprise. I think one of the reasons was the schedule, with Saturday and Sunday being an active day of Nostalgia and AMA flying while Old Timer events were flown all three days at the contestant's convenience. Old Timers did the majority of their flying on Monday (Columbus Day) when most working people had to return to work. It was a good day for flying Texaco, 1/4A and 1/2A Texaco, plus Old Time Scale which is flown like a Texaco Event. All Texaco events could be flown all three days but needed to be finished by 11 a.m. each day to help keep the chase to a reasonable length (and preserve the "Old" Timers).

ROW is a fun event and there is always a lot of pre-contest excitement but it fails to show up on "game day". We have a great pond and Holloway Gypsum is kind enough to fill for us. We need more participation and hopefully more pointed pre-advertisements and encouragement will improve this....as the English say "we shall keep pressing forward".

The guys are catching onto the Sweepstakes and Event Championships and the techniques and how to win \$\$\$\$. One point for each minute in the air, one point for each contestant bested to a maximum of 18 points per event. You must fly several different events and categories which mean you must be a cross-over flyer in both power and non-power. The intent rule applies and is interpreted by the CD. 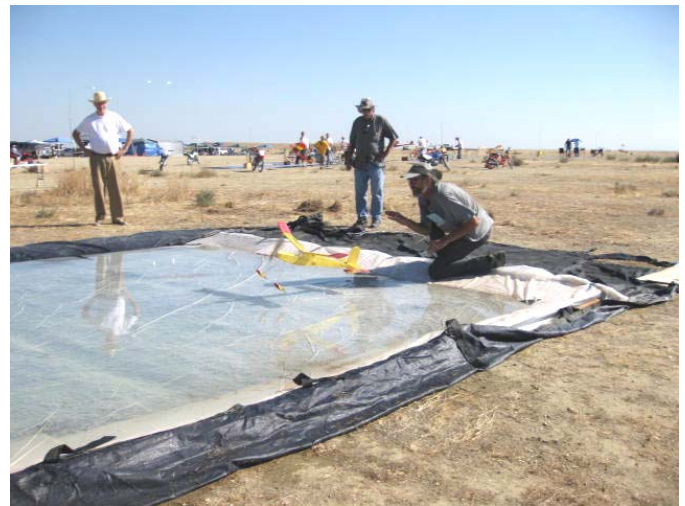
Back to the contest...many events were closely contested with only a few seconds between places, In Catapult Glider there were only four seconds between first and second place; AMA B/C 1260 to 1200 seconds; in P-30 the difference was 10 seconds; Mulvihill was 11 seconds; Electric was nine seconds; 1/2A Texaco was seven seconds between 2nd and 3rd; .020 Replica had a 13 second gap; and 1/2A Nostalgia was won by only 3 seconds. Jim Springer got three maxes in ROW Rubber flying a Convertible.

Interesting story: Tom Carman's fuel bladder burst and sprayed his airplane, hands, wrists and DT fuse with

fuel causing ignition. Everyone hurried to extinguish the flames on the plane not realizing that Tom was frantically trying to put out the fire on his hands. Long story short...Tom and his wife Carolyn drove to the hospital (non-life-threatening injury and extended ETA for medical personnel)...anyway, as Tom was entering the ER he remembered he had three maxes in B Gas and called the field to ask, "Can we find someone to proxy fly my next flight?" His brother Jeff stepped forward..started, launched and with a misjudged needle valve setting. The result was five seconds up and five seconds down. All worked out okay, Tom moved from 3rd to 2nd. Tom returned to fly all day Monday; the man is our "Energizer Bunny". Tom's note to all "Put the fuse at the tail".

Everyone seemed to have a great time and hopefully we can entice more flyers from around the country to come experience our great field and fine flying weather at Lost Hills FF Model Airfield.
